JOB SUMMARY

The Nursing Faculty-Medical Surgical Nursing-is responsible to the Associate Dean of Nursing in the performance of all instructional and administrative responsibilities. The faculty member is committed to academic excellence in all areas of teaching and learning including theory, laboratory, and clinical instruction. The faculty actively participates in program development and evaluation; curriculum development, evaluation, and revision; student admission, progression, retention, and graduation policies; course planning, implementation, and evaluation, supervision of skills/simulation experience, clinical instruction; and evaluation of student achievement including formative and summative evaluation. The faculty member coordinates and collaborates with colleagues and students in a wide range of supervised, self-directed, and technologically mediated learning activities including the ongoing monitoring and improvement of the teaching-learning process. The faculty member effectively participates in the affairs of the program and the division, and provides professional leadership in the University, nursing profession, and community.

Nursing Faculty hold academic rank based upon credentials and experience and to meet expectations for teaching load as defined by the University. Full-time faculty teaching load (assignments) allow adequate administrative time for classroom, online, laboratory, and clinical preparation.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

In addition to the policies and procedures contained in the *Spalding University Faculty Governance Document*, *Spalding University Policy Manual*, *Bylaws of the Faculty Organization of the School of Nursing*, and the Policies and Procedures of the School of Nursing, the following duties and responsibilities include:

Duties and Responsibilities

1. Support the mission and philosophy of Spalding University.
2. Develop, implement, evaluate, and update the mission (purpose), philosophy, learning outcomes (objectives) of the nursing education programs in the Nursing Division.
3. Plan and provide theoretical instruction, clinical experiences, and laboratory (skill and/or simulation) experiences that reflect an understanding of the philosophy, objectives, and curriculum of the nursing education program.
4. Design, implement, and evaluate the curriculum.
5. Develop, evaluate, and revise student admission, progression, retention, and graduation policies within the policies of the Spalding University and the School of Nursing.
6. Participate in academic advising and guidance of students.
7. Evaluate student achievement of curricular outcomes (objectives) related to nursing knowledge and practice.
8. Effectively prepare for classroom, laboratory, and clinical experiences.
9. Actively participate in department, school, and University committees.
10. Engage in service to the University, the community, and the profession.
11. Other duties as identified and/or assigned.



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Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

1. A doctorate in nursing or a related field is preferred. A master's degree in nursing is required.
2. An active license in good standing to practice as a Registered Nurse in Kentucky is required.
3. Two years of full-time, or equivalent, professional nursing clinical experience.
4. Two years of full-time, or equivalent, teaching experience in a baccalaureate or higher degree program preferred.
5. Documented knowledge and skills related to the teaching of adults, teaching methodology, curriculum development, and curriculum evaluation.
6. Knowledge and understanding of Microsoft Office Suite, in particular Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook preferred.
7. Experience with online education preferred.
8. Experience with Moodle or similar system preferred.
9. Working irregular hours, including evenings and weekends, may be expected.

Nature of Work Environment

1. Tasks involve the ability to manage multiple meetings, priorities, extensive e-mail communication, projects, people, and activities.
2. Tasks may involve extended periods of time at a computer keyboard or workstation.
