

## **Satisfactory Academic Progress Appeal Form**

To maintain eligibility for federal financial aid, regulations require students to maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). At Spalding University this means students must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average (undergraduate students = 2.0 G.P.A; graduate student = 3.0 G.P.A), must earn at least 75% of all attempted, and must complete a degree within a maximum number of credit hours.

To appeal for reinstatement of financial aid eligibility at Spalding University, please complete this form and submit it to the Financial Aid Office with all required information and documentation.

Appeal must be typed. Incomplete appeals will not be considered.

- 3. Financial Aid Appeals must include all of the following (incomplete appeals will not be considered):
- The Satisfactory Academic Progress Appeal Form (complete, legible and signed).
- A detailed letter from the student which:
  - Thoroughly explains the circumstances which prevented satisfactory academic progress in the past and how/why those circumstances affected the student AND
  - Clearly explains how the circumstances have been resolved to ensure satisfactory academic progress in the future. This should include the steps/resources that will be taken to improve academic performance
- Documentation to support/verify the circumstances cited in the letter. For example, illness and/or injury can be documented with hospital or insurance records; a death can be documented with an obituary or funeral card; divorce can be documented with signed letter from a lawyer or a copy of the divorce decree etc. Letters must be signed and must contain contact information (the phone number, email address, etc. of the person who wrote and signed the letter). Documentation cannot be from family members, significant others, roommates, etc.
- If you are appealing because you will not earn your degree within the 150% timeframe, you
  must attach a list of the required classes you still need to take and that list must be signed by
  your advisor.
