Spalding University

Mission

Spalding University is a diverse community of learners dedicated to meeting the needs of the times in the tradition of the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth through quality undergraduate and graduate liberal and professional studies, grounded in spiritual values, with emphasis on service and the promotion of peace and justice.

Accomplishments

In the midst of an ongoing healthcare crisis, with Kentucky facing shortages of nurses and mental healthcare professionals, Spalding enrolled its first class in Doctor of Physical Therapy and dedicated an \$8 million Kosair for Kids School of Physical Therapy and Inter-professional Education building.

Notable recent grants and gifts supporting Spalding's students and programs include a \$4.5 million gift for scholarships for students in the Bachelor of Science in Education program, which will support Spalding's efforts to address Kentucky's teacher deficit. The School of Nursing received over \$3.3 million from the Department of Labor and the Legacy Foundation to support nursing students. Spalding University has also been awarded over \$1.15 million in HRSA grants in FY2023 and \$418,930 in HRSA grants in FY2022.

The Doctor of Clinical Psychology program again achieved a 100% internship match rate for the 2022-23 academic year, the 10th straight year it has done so. Our most recently available Professional Licensure Exam pass rate accomplishments include a pass rate of 95% for Master of Science in Nursing -Family Nurse Practitioner students on the American Association of Nurse Practitioners (AANP) examination, and a pass rate of 91% for Doctor of Occupational Therapy students on the National Board of Certification for (Occupational Therapy (NBCOT) examination. The School of Education had a 100% pass rate for first-time takers for the PRAXIS II examination.

The Spalding Eagles athletic teams are a source of pride for the university. The Men's baseball and Women's Softball made it to the NCAA III tournament in 2023. Spalding's Athletics department also launched its Eagle Excellence (Mental Health) program in Fall of 2023.
