
#### **Common FAFSA Mistakes**

- 1. Not filing at all
- 2. Using the wrong website
- 3. Not Using DRT
- 4. Marking Legal Guardianship or Ward of the Court
- 5. Reporting scholarships and grants that were not taxable
- 6. Confusing parent info and student info
- 7. Inputting the same amount for taxes paid and agi
- 8. Not including parent information
- 9. Not registering with selective service (if born male)
- 10. Student and or parent not signing FAFSA



If you don't have court paperwork but feel like you have a special circumstance call the financial aid office.




#### **Additional Financial Information**


Enter the amount of your parents' income tax for 2019. Transferred from the IRS 2019 Additional Financial Information Education credits (American Opportunity Tax Credit or Transferred from the IRS Lifetime Learning Tax Credit) from IRS Child support your parents paid because of divorce or 0 00 separation or as a result of a legal requirement. Do not include support for children in your parents' household. Taxable earnings from need-based employment programs. 0 00 such as Federal Work-study and need-based employment portions of fellowships and assistantships Student college grant and scholarship aid reported to the IRS scholarship 0 00 in your parents' income. 







#### **AGI versus Taxes Paid**

#### **Parent Info**

If the FAFSA is asking for parent info you need to include it. Just leaving it off the FAFSA will create errors. If there are special circumstances, you need to talk to the financial aid office to find out your next steps.

If you are a graduate student and that FAFSA asks if you would like to include parent info, you can say no.



### **SELECTIVE SERVICE**


Your gender is used to determine if you need to register with the Selective Service System. Most male citizens and male immigrants must register with the Selective Service System to receive federal student aid. This requirement applies to any person assigned the gender of male at birth.

Selective Service registration is required by law as the first part of a fair and equitable system that, if authorized by the President and Congress, would rapidly provide personnel to the Department of Defense while at the same time providing for an Alternative Service Program for conscientious objectors. By registering, a young man remains eligible for jobs, Federal student aid, State-based student aid in 31 states, Federally-funded job training, and U.S. citizenship for immigrant men



## Sign and Submit

 Make sure that you SIGN and SUBMIT the FAFSA. If you are dependent and had to include parent information the parent must SIGN and SUBMIT as well. If this is done you will get a confirmation screen as well as a confirmation email.
